Our first OFF THE COLLAR is a message from Bishop Paula Schmidt in regards to our Pastoral vacancy.



September 27, 2023

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

This past week I met with Mt. Calvary's Congregation Council concerning your current pastoral vacancy and the details of a transition. There were several questions which your Council felt might be best answered in writing by me. As well, Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Kevin Shock will be with you in-person and can answer these and other questions.

When our office was made aware that Pastor Klimke was participating in a call process, I began the search for an interim pastor for Mt. Calvary. Pastor Kevin and I interviewed three people from other synods and extended an invitation to two pastors in our synod. When that did not yield any prospects, I extended a plea to the 65 bishops in the ELCA Conference of Bishops. There were no available candidates interested in moving to Pennsylvania. That is not—hear that again NOT—because of anything related to Mt. Calvary. Mobility, which means a rostered minister's desire and ability to move or change calls, is very slow across the ELCA.

That means there are fewer rostered ministers (pastors and deacons) who are interested in moving. That has affected our ability to find and place interim pastors as well as called pastors in open congregations. I have been in contact with some of our ecumenical partners about this issue and they are facing the same obstacles. In the early weeks of your pastoral vacancy, I received the names of seven pastors from the call committee. They asked me to be in contact with them concerning your open call. Unfortunately, those seven pastors were not available for the call process. Pastor Kevin and I continue to work to find Mt. Calvary an interim pastor and candidates for the called pastor position.

Transition is hard. The many details of ministry that still need to happen whether there is a called pastor in place can feel overwhelming. I understand the frustrations. During a transition, it's important to lean in and not step back. Often there are details that need to be cared for and having volunteers for those tasks is important for the stability of the congregation.

Not only is there a shortage of pastors available for calls, but there also are fewer authorized lay worship leaders. On any given Sunday, there are 30-32 congregations without worship leader coverage. We have 14 active authorized lay worship leaders and 6 ordained pastors who are able to provide supply coverage in our Synod. That leaves a dozen or more congregations without supply coverage each week. We have a volunteer who works with congregations and lay worship leaders to schedule coverage. There are limitations to that scheduling which include willingness to travel, family commitments, and health concerns among others.

I know Claudia Plows was helping to fill some of the voids in the congregation with worship. leadership and there is frustration and resentment that she has been assigned to a different congregation to do her ministerial practice while she attends seminary. Mt. Calvary is a busy and complex congregation. Despite Claudia knowing the congregation well, Claudia's experience in running a congregation is limited at this time. As well, balancing a busy congregation with seminary education can be challenging. We want to give Claudia the best chance for success in both building her leadership skills and learning at new level in seminary.

I know hearing that we are doing the best we can is probably not much comfort at this time. I wish I had more to tell you. We will continue to work with local pastors to see whether we can provide coverage in different ways to ease the stress on members. Thank you for your willingness to work together in this challenging situation.
