OFF THE COLLAR from THE CALL COMMITTEE

Greetings from the Call Committee. We wanted to provide everyone with a brief update as to the status of our search for a new pastor and some basic information surrounding that process.

Shortly after Pastor's Klimke and Pastor Adams announced their decisions to take new calls, members of the congregation were appointed to form a Call Committee with the purpose of finding the next pastor to lead Mt. Calvary. The Ministry Site Profile (MSP) was completed, reviewed by the Bishop and added to the ELCA website. The Bishop advised there were approximately thirty openings in the synod and six hundred openings nationwide. With only one hundred seminary graduates each year, the time to fill vacancies could be more than two years.

After several months without any identified candidates, and considering the high number of pastoral openings, and the Bishop's less than optimistic outlook, the Church Council directed the Stewardship Committee to conduct research into the feasibility of retaining a search firm to assist the Call Committee. Ultimately, the Stewardship Committee and the Council identified The Shepherd Staff as the firm best suited to assist the Call Committee.

The Shepherd Staff was introduced to the Call Committee, and we agreed that their assistance would be invaluable and provide us with the tools necessary to find the right candidate to lead Mt Calvary into the future. To date, the Call Committee has not received any viable candidates from the Synod or from The Shepherd Staff.

Please remember that according to our church constitution, the process for selecting a new pastor consists of three steps.

- Step one, the Call Committee considers potential candidates, conducts interviews, observes services, and ultimately makes a recommendation to the church council. A two-thirds vote of the committee is required to recommend the candidate to the council.
- ❖ Step two, the Church Council reviews the recommendation presented by the Call Committee. A two-thirds vote of the Council is required to recommend the candidate to the congregation.
- Step three, the Call Committee and Church Council present the candidate to the congregation at a meeting called for this purpose. A two-thirds vote of the voting members present is required to call the candidate.

First and foremost, let us assure you that the Call Committee's desire and direction to The Shepherd Staff is to preferably identify a Lutheran Minister as our next leader. Additionally, the ELCA has identified several denominations which we are in "Full

Communion" with and pastors from those denominations are also able to serve as our leader. This process is also outlined in the Mt Calvary Constitution. The Shepherd Staff is aware of these partners and may potentially present a full communion pastor to the Call Committee for consideration. The Call Committee is not considering candidates who are not ordained through the Lutheran Church or one of the full communion partners. The other denominations include:

- Presbyterian Church (USA). Presbyterian Church (USA) Full Communion partner since 1997.
- ❖ Reformed Church in America. Reformed Church in America Full Communion partner since 1997.
- United Church of Christ. United Church of Christ Full Communion partner since 1997.
- ❖ The Episcopal Church. The Episcopal Church Full Communion partner since 1999.
- The Moravian Church. The Moravian Church Full Communion partner since 1999
- United Methodist Church. United Methodist Church Full Communion partner since 2009.

Full communion is when two denominations develop a relationship based on a common confessing of the Christian faith and a mutual recognition of Baptism and sharing of the Lord's Supper. This does not mean the two denominations merge; rather, in reaching agreements, denominations also respect differences. These denominations worship together, may exchange clergy and also share a commitment to evangelism, witness and service in the world. Each entity agrees that even with differences, there is nothing that is church dividing.

A central document to Lutherans is the Augsburg Confession. Article VII of the Augsburg Confession states that "the true unity of the church" is present where the gospel is rightly preached, and sacraments rightly administered. The ELCA is committed to this model of full communion as an authentic expression of Christian unity.

For the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the characteristics of full communion are theological and missiological implications of the Gospel that allow variety and flexibility. These characteristics stress that the church acts ecumenically for the sake of the world, not for itself alone. They will include at least the following, some of which exist at earlier stages: a common confessing of the Christian faith; a mutual recognition of Baptism and a sharing of the Lord's Supper, allowing for joint worship and an exchangeability of members; a mutual recognition and availability of ordained ministers to the service of all members of churches in full communion, subject to the disciplinary regulations of other churches; a common commitment to evangelism, witness, and service; a means of common decision making on critical common issues of faith and life; a mutual lifting of any condemnations that exist between churches.
